Beverly Hills, Cali., November 10, 2008 - Fresh out of the polling stations to elect our nation's next President, residents in Wyoming will be 'saved' by Hampton® Hotels' Save-A-Landmark® program in 2009. - Cheyenne Botanic Gardens and Historic Arboretum, Cheyenne, Wyo., Cheyenne Botanic Gardens tells the history of the West not in gun battles and bank robberies but in plants. Visitors to the state's only public gardens can walk through a landscape that features plants, a working windmill, wagon and solar kitchen.
- Cheyenne Depot Museum, Cheyenne, Wyo., The museum tells the story about the establishment of Cheyenne during the construction of the Transcontinental Railroad, the operation of the Union Pacific Railroad and the history of the construction of the Union Pacific Depot.

Historic Atlas Theater, Cheyenne, Wyo., This typical Vaudevillian Theater has been an anchor to downtown Cheyenne since 1887. The Atlas Building was converted to a theatre in 1908. Seating almost 550, the stage was sufficient for the traveling companies of the time, a soda fountain, a penny arcade and parlor.
